

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING

JOINT RECOMMENDATIONS COMMITTEE**

**KING COUNTY HOME PROGRAM CONSORTIUM and  
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) CONSORTIUM**

The King County HOME and CDBG Consortiums are established under interlocal cooperation agreements between King County and 31 suburban cities and towns. A portion of the CDBG funds are available to projects serving residents of the following communities:

**North/East Sub-region cities:** Bothell, Carnation, Clyde Hill, Duvall, Hunts Point, Issaquah, Kenmore, Kirkland, Lake Forest Park, Mercer Island, North Bend, Redmond, Sammamish, Skykomish, Snoqualmie, Woodinville, Yarrow Point and unincorporated area of North/East King County.

**South Sub-region cities:** Algona, Black Diamond, Burien, Covington, Des Moines, Enumclaw, Maple Valley, Pacific, SeaTac, Tukwila and unincorporated area of South King County.

The cities of Auburn, Bellevue and Kent join the above communities in the HOME Program Consortium.

King County is the official applicant and administrator of CDBG and HOME funds on behalf of the King County CDBG and HOME Program Consortium. An inter-jurisdictional Joint Recommendations Committee (JRC) advises the County on CDBG and HOME funding decisions.

**2011 Federal Budget Reductions to CDBG and HOME Funds**

The public is invited to hear the contingency plans, and any revisions to those plans, that will be adopted in order to accommodate decreases in federal funding levels for both the HOME Program (approximate 11% reduction) and CDBG Program (approximate 16% reduction) in 2011. The Joint Recommendations Committee will open up the meeting for a period of public comment following a review of potential cut impacts, and prior to any action to adopt plans for distribution of cuts to projects. This hearing will take place during the regularly scheduled JRC meeting on Thursday, May 26, 2011. The meeting will begin at 9:30 a.m. at Mercer View Community Center, 8236 SE 24th Street, Mercer Island, WA 98040.

**Public Comment**

Attendance by persons of low or moderate-income is encouraged, particularly residents of predominantly low and moderate-income neighborhoods from all areas in which King County may use CDBG funds.
