**King County DCHS/DDECSD will reimburse for the costs of the following items purchased between July 1, 2021 - June 30, 2023. If funds are not spent or planned for by April 1, 2023, funds may be re-distributed.

These funds must be spent in alignment with the following priorities (see below for details):

- 1. Family Support and Stabilization
- 2. Infant Mental Health (IMH) Consultation
- 3. Workforce Diversity and Stabilization
- 4. Technology
- 5. Public Awareness and Child Find Enhancement
- 6. Other LocallyDriven Priorities (with prior approval from King County)

If requesting reimbursement for staff time, time must be tracked separately.

Receipts and/or other documentation of purchase must be included in the Invoice.

Examples of Pre-Approved ARPA Reimbursements

1. Family Support & Stabilization

- Compassionate care funds for families to temporarily support uncovered service costs, copays, coinsurance, deductibles, family fees;
- Support for basic needs for families including diapers and food;
- Transportation supports including bus passes or gas cards;
- Translation or interpretation costs that aren't otherwise covered by King County;
- COVID supplies for families;
- Stipends to support family engagement activities.

2. Infant Mental Health Consultation

- Recruitment costs for qualified, representative Infant Mental Health providers to support language and cultural match, including advertising position, relocation costs, and sign-on bonuses;
- Staff time for Infant Mental Health specialists that is not otherwise reimbursed.

3. Workforce Diversity & Stabilization

- Staff time for Reflective Consultation;
- Staff retention bonuses;
- College tuition reimbursements;
- Concrete supports to address staff needs resulting from COVID-19 impacts;
- Recruitment of a diverse, representative workforce to support language and cultural match for families, including advertising position, relocation costs, and sign-on bonuses;
- Training in culturally appropriate evidence based coaching practices and effective virtual home visiting.

4. Technology

• Technology needed by families to participate in virtual home visit, including tablets and data, Wi-Fi access or cell phone minutes

5. Public Awareness & Child Find Enhancement

- Cultural navigation supports, for example contracting with individuals or community-based organizations to provide a cultural match for families;
- Child find efforts that direct families/referral sources to contact our central referral provider (WithinReach);

6. Other Locally-Driven Priorities
