1	A RESOLUTION recognizing the Global to Local Health
2	Initiative as an innovative strategy to improve health
3	inequities in King County.
4	WHEREAS, despite being home to some of the most advanced health care in the
5	world, King County experiences some of the worst health inequities in the nation, and
6	WHEREAS, the cities of SeaTac and Tukwila, in particular, have lower life
7	expectancy and higher rates of disease when compared to much of the rest of the county;
8	however, these cities have many assets, including strong leadership and organizations,
9	and
10	WHEREAS, Public Health - Seattle & King County, Swedish Health Services,
11	HealthPoint Community Health Clinics and the Washington Global Health Alliance are
12	partnering with the cities of SeaTac and Tukwila to develop the Global to Local Health
13	Initiative, and
14	WHEREAS, Global to Local builds on the expertise of Washington state's global
15	health institutions, bringing home strategies that have proved effective in addressing
16	needs and health disparities in developing countries, and
17	WHEREAS, Global to Local is piloting approaches to improve individual and
18	community health outcomes, lower health care costs and empower economic
19	development, and

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20	WHEREAS, global models include a diverse team of community health workers
21	who engage their neighbors to identify health priorities, develop leadership and promote
22	community health, as well as using new technologies to improve the provision of and
23	access to interpretation services, and
24	WHEREAS, Global to Local is a unique public-private partnership with
25	additional support from Providence Health & Services, the JPMorgan Chase Foundation,
26	Novo Nordisk and the Workforce Development Council;
27	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Health of King
28	County:
29	The Board of Health supports the valuable partnerships, strategies and activities
