#### **JOB DUTIES:**

Safe and efficient operation of vehicles with a minimum load capacity ranging from 0 to 25 yards. The incumbent drives dump trucks with transfer or flatbed trailers to move equipment as well as multiple other pieces of equipment such as, but not limited to, a garbage compactor or sweeper truck.

This is the third level in a three-level Truck Driver series and is distinguished from other levels in that the incumbent operates vehicles with a fifth wheel, multiple trailers and large capacity loads with 50-foot trailers.

#### **ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS ACCORDING TO THE EMPLOYER:**

All King County jobs require ability/essential function to:

- Demonstrate predictable, reliable, and timely attendance.
- Follow written and verbal directions to complete assigned tasks on schedule.
- Read, write, and communicate in English & understand basic math.
- Learn from directions, observations, and mistakes and apply procedures using good judgment.
- Work independently or as part of a team and interact appropriately with others.

### Job Specific Requirements:

- 1. Perform a safety inspection of the vehicle and its systems.
- 2. Drive a truck with trailer for moving equipment and materials to and from work sites.
- 3. Drive a truck to transport asphalt, sand, gravel and other materials.
- 4. Drive and spread gravel, salt, sand, oil, asphalt and other materials used for park construction, modification and maintenance.
- 5. Fills in for the compactor and sweeper driver in their absence.
- 6. Secures loads.
- 1. Operate trucks and trailers to spread asphalt and rock and remove snow and ice. Drive truck combinations to spread gravel, salt, sand, oil, asphalt and other materials.
- 2. Drive a variety of vehicles including trailer truck, truck with snowplow attachment, vacuum truck, truck equipped with water storage tank and pump, spray truck, truck-tractors, truck-tractors with tank trailers, tractor-trailer with heavy equipment trailer, dump trucks with pony trailer, water trucks, fuel tanker trucks, boom trucks, belly dumps and 50-foot refuse trailers.
- 3. Transport asphalt, sand, gravel and other materials.

- 4. Respond to on-site accidents, emergencies and potential hazardous spills.
- 5. Perform visual safety inspection of vehicle.
- 6. Check and refill fluid levels and tire pressure; refuel vehicle.
- 7. Maintain records.
- 8. Maintain vehicle cleanliness.
- 9. Check fuel storage tanks used for emergency generators and pumps to ensure operation.
- 10. Fuel truck tractors and equipment.
- 11. Transport materials to work areas.
- 12. Load equipment and transport to work areas.
- 13. Check vacuum truck for potential hazardous fumes.
- 14. Perform other duties as assigned.

### When working as Lead Truck Driver III:

- 1. Perform load counts and switch drivers as needed. Monitor and coordinate transfer station timing to control fluctuating tonnage.
- 2. Check loads remaining and prepare dispatch for next day.
- 3. Make assignments to crew.
- 4. Track hours worked, sick leave and vacation taken. Ensure paperwork is completed correctly.
- 5. Maintain various records including dispatch forms and leachate reports.

### Machines, Tools, Special Equipment, Personal Protective Equipment Used:

Dump truck, trailer, sweeper truck, compactor truck, various hoists, flagging paddle, shovel, tire chains, diesel fuel, various machinery fluids such as oil, transfer flatbed trailer, forklift, two-way radio, various hand tools, water truck, pickup, daily time cards, maintenance reports, inspection reports, work orders, scale cards, computer, e-mail, timesheets and computerized scale system.
