## How can I make a difference?

- Research shows that 27% of children who receive early intervention require no further services after their third birthday. (Birth to Three Development Center)
- Over 8,000 individuals are homeless on any given night in this region, and an estimated 40,000 children in King County live in poverty. (Church Council of Greater Seattle: City of Seattle 2009 – 2012 Consolidated Plan)
- More than 54 million (or nearly one in five) Americans have a mental disorder in any given year. In King County, that translates to nearly 376,000 individuals. (Community Psychiatric Clinic)
- As of May of 2009 most emergency feeding programs in Seattle were seeing a 20% to 30% increase in the number of families requesting services. (Food Resource Network Federation)
- In Latin America today, an estimated 94 million people live on less than \$2 a day and in the 7 countries where we work, 52% live below their country's national poverty line. (Global Partnerships)
- Nationally, Nearly 6 out of 10 residents in nursing homes never have a visitor. (Elder and Adult Day Services)
- Ovarian cancer is the most deadly gynecologic cancer – of the 22,000 women diagnosed annually, 15,000 will die. Washington State has the highest mortality rate in the nation. More than 70% of women with ovarian cancer are diagnosed in the late stage and their prognosis is poor. (Marsha Rivkin Ovarian Research Center)
- There were 799,000 children served in the national foster care system during 2005. Of which 65% experienced seven or more school changes and a full 75,000 experienced homelessness after aging out of care. (Casey Family Programs: Mockingbird Society)
- Approximately 6-8 million cats and dogs enter shelters every year. (PAWS: Humane Society of the United States)

## How should I decide where to donate?

You are already on the right track! You have opened this catalog. What interests you? What are you passionate about? What need do you think needs to be filled? Do you have a personal connection to something? This catalog is a great resource. You can also go to the EGP Web site for more information on the nonprofits and links to their websites.

## I don't see my favorite nonprofit, how do I get them included?

Each year between February and April, the Employee Giving Program requires nonprofits that want to be included in that year's campaign to apply and meet eligibility requirements. ## What are the eligibility requirements?

- Registered as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization.
- Registered with the Secretary of State to solicit donations in Washington.
- Been in active existence for at least 3 years.
- Non-discrimination policies to the same ordinance standard set by King County or have a legal exemption.
- Total administrative costs are no more than 25% for two consecutive years.

## What does it cost to run the program?

Charities participate in workplace giving because the cost is lower and the visibility higher than other fundraising methods. Typically, the administrative percentage to run the Employee Giving Program has been between 8-11% of total donations. This fee pays for the direct costs of the program including catalog and marketing materials, events, personnel, and county overhead and space costs. It is applied proportionately among nonprofits who receive donations. This is comparable to other public sector workplace giving programs. It also lowers nonprofits overall administrative costs because of the efficiencies involved with receiving one report and one check. The EGP saves employees over \$25,000 in stamps alone each year, compared to if employees mailed their own checks.

## How do I get a cool shirt?

You can order shirts from the EGP while supplies last! Download the shirt order form from the website and send it in with a check (made payable to the KCEGP) for \$10.00 to CNK-ES-0231.

## What is a federation?

A federation is an umbrella nonprofit group which raises money for its member nonprofit organizations through workplace giving campaigns. They also act as the main point of contact for their member charities. Often federations represent similar types of nonprofit organizations such as "children" or "the environment." The King County Employee Giving Program allows nonprofit organizations to participate directly or as part of a federation.

## THE FINE PRINT

### General

- Direct, payroll, and time donations may be tax deductible. Consult with your tax advisor if you have questions about this. Please make a copy of your pledge form for tax purposes. Regardless of how you give, you are making a world of difference in our communities.
- Please no write-ins, including for direct checks. During the application process, all participating nonprofits have been vetted against standardized eligibility criteria. If you would like to see a nonprofit in the program, please email their contact information to the EGP administrator and they will be contacted for the following year's campaign. Write-ins will be returned for correction. No nonprofit in the program is allowed to funnel money to another nonprofit as a way to circumvent the eligibility process.
- For all fundraising options, including special events, you may include your donation in a pool of money that will be distributed among all nonprofits that receive donations, leave the code section blank and write "campaign."

### Rules for direct checks

1. You may give to as many participating nonprofit organizations as you would like.
2. Write the check directly payable to the nonprofit organization and write the four digit code in the memo line.
3. To include your donation in a pool of money that will be distributed among all nonprofits who receive donations, write the check out to the KCEGP and write "campaign" in the memo line.
4. Checks are a 2009 tax event.

### Rules for payroll deductions

1. Minimum donation per organization, per deduction, is \$5.00.
2. Maximum number of organization designations is six.
3. If you choose Option B on the donation form, your donation will be deducted from the second paycheck each month.

### Rules for time donations

1. Time donations cannot be accepted after November 20, 2009. This is a firm deadline.
2. Minimum donation is 4 hours. Maximum donation is 40 hours, unless you have excess vacation time - then there is no maximum.
3. You can make a donation of time to a single designation (i.e., one nonprofit organization, one federation, or the campaign generally). This is mandated by ordinance.
4. The net cash value of your hours (after all mandatory withholdings, including withholding in accordance with retirement plans, federal income tax and the Federal Insurance Contributions Act) will be calculated and sent to your designated agency. You will receive a receipt notifying you of the net cash value of your time donation.

### Dedication of your donation

If you would like to make your donation *in honor of* someone living or *in memory of* someone deceased, please complete the optional section to the right of your organization designations. The dedications are given to the nonprofits regardless of whether you release your name and address. You may also use the dedication line to designate a particular program or area of service within a particular nonprofit.

### Privacy Option

Please check to either release your information or to remain anonymous. If this section is left blank, you will automatically be listed as anonymous. If you choose not to release your information, you will not be acknowledged from the nonprofit organization.

### Rules for special events

If you are planning a special event in support of the charitable campaign, please contact the Employee Giving Program Administrator for a Special Event Form and guidelines. While a special event may feature a particular nonprofit or cause, employees must be allowed the option to specify their donation to the participating nonprofit of their choice. Cash must be converted to a cashier's check or money order. If there are several nonprofits, you may make the check out to the Campaign (KCEGP) and attach a breakdown of the nonprofits. The amount will then be included with their first quarter 2010 checks. There are special tax rules regarding special events and the value of both items donated and the donation that you may give. Talk to a tax professional for more information.

### CHANGES IN TAX LAW REGARDING WORKPLACE CHARITABLE GIVING

RE: IRS Notice 2006-110 "Recordkeeping Requirements for Charitable Contributions made by Payroll Deduction"

**New rules apply to contributions made January 1, 2007 and later. Please follow the new rules for employee charitable contributions:**

**Payroll deduction:** To claim an income tax deduction the employee must have a pay stub, W-2 or other employer document showing the total amount withheld for the charitable organization **AND** a photocopy of the donor pledge card. This is needed to substantiate and claim a tax deduction. A letter prepared by or at the direction of the charity (stating the date, amount donated, and "no goods or services language") also qualifies.

**Cash, a check, or other monetary gift:** To claim an income tax deduction, the employee must have a bank record (cancelled check, bank or credit card statement) **OR** written acknowledgement from a charitable organization showing the date, amount contributed, and name of the organization.

**Please keep:**

-Your last pay stub of the year. It shows the total amount donated to charity via payroll deduction.

-A copy of your pledge form.

-Verification from the participating nonprofit listing your contribution, *unless you donated anonymously.*
