





Instructions

Use a black ink pen to completely fill in the oval next to your choice.


How to correct a mistake



To make a correction, draw a line through the entire measure response or candidate's name.

You then have the option of making another choice by completely filling in another oval.

Optional write-in



To add a new candidate, fill in the oval next to the write-in line and print the name on the write-in line.

Always look at both sides of your ballot.

! Do not cut, tear or damage the ballot.

READ: Each candidate for partisan office may state a political party that he or she prefers. A candidate's preference does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party, or that the party approves of or associates with that candidate.

The PDA would seek public and private funding, including City funds, for this purpose and be responsible for its monetary liabilities.
