Register to vote

Requirements

To register to vote in Washington, you must be:

- A citizen of the United States
- A legal resident of Washington state
- At least 18 years old by election day
- Not disqualified from voting due to a court order
- Not under Department of Corrections supervision for a Washington felony conviction

How to register

- Register online with the Secretary of State, www.vote.wa.gov.
- Download a registration form from the King County Elections website.
- Register in person at the King County Elections office or at the King County Voter Registration Annex.

Registration deadlines

While you may register to vote at any time, there are registration deadlines before each election. The deadlines for the April 25, 2017 Special Election are:

- March 27 Deadline to register to vote or update voter registration information.
- April 17 In-person registration deadline for people not currently registered in Washington. Register in person at the Elections office in Renton or at the Voter Registration Annex in Seattle.

Keep your voter registration current

Update your registration if you have moved or changed your name, or if your signature has changed. Simply submit a new registration form to update your information.

Accessible voting options

Voting by mail is a convenient option for most people. There are other options available.

Online Ballot Marking Program

- Any registered voter can use the online ballot marking program.
- Voters with disabilities can mark their choices. on the ballot online. The online ballot marking program has been designed specifically to enable blind and vision-impaired voters to cast a private ballot.
- If a voter's ballot is damaged or lost, voters may mark their ballot on a computer, print it out, and return it by fax, standard mail, or email before the 8 p.m. election day deadline.
- Overseas and service voters may request to permanently receive their ballot using this program.

Accessible Voting Centers

Accessible voting centers are available for voters who need assistance completing their ballot. Trained staff and specialized equipment are available to help voters with disabilities cast a private, independent ballot. Mail ballots can also be dropped off at any accessible voting center, when open.

Proposition No. 1 General Obligation Bonds - \$9,997,500

The Board of Directors of Vashon Island School District No. 402 adopted Resolution No. 748 concerning this proposition for bonds. This proposition authorizes the District to improve the track and field at the High School, improve the Middle and Elementary School, construct a maintenance facility, make other capital improvements, issue \$9,997,500 of general obligation bonds maturing within a maximum of 21 years, and levy excess property taxes annually to repay the bonds, as detailed in Resolution No. 748. Proposition No. 1, we move forward with necessary upgrades and replacements. Our school board is obligated to maintain district assets, and will continue to ask for our support until these projects are addressed. Let's tackle these issues now to avoid higher costs in the future. The school board listened to voters after rejection of a \$26.9 million bond proposal in 2016 and, with the community's input, has worked hard to hold costs under \$10 million. Proposition No. 1 will add less than \$5 per month in property tax to a \$500,000 home.

Beyond the financial incentives, a "Yes" vote now will offer benefits to our school campuses and our community at large. The turf field will minimize our environmental impact, saving 1.5 million gallons of water per year. Renovations to school buildings and construction of a maintenance facility will improve safety and extend facility life. The all-weather functionality of the track and field will accommodate year-round use by our students, island youth and active adults sorely in need of adequate playing fields.

Our assets are aging, costly and out-of-date. Let's move forward with a "Yes" vote.

general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$9,997,500, maturing within 21 years of the date of issue, for the purpose of making improvements to school facilities to provide the students of the District with adequate, proper and safe educational facilities, and to levy excess property taxes sufficient to pay the bonds.

Such improvements include upgrading the track and field at the High School, improving the Middle, Elementary and High Schools, constructing a new maintenance facility and making other capital improvements. The projects include necessary equipment, supplies, appurtenances, and services to complete the projects.

Exemptions from taxes may be available to homeowners who are 61 or older, or disabled, and who meet certain income requirements. For more information, call the King County Department of Assessments at 206.296.3920.
