1. Announcements

- IWAC Member, Ken Falcone, announced that Cargill Corn Milling North America has applied for the Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award. The Baldrige Award is given by the President of the United States to businesses and to education, health care, and nonprofit organizations that apply and are judged to be outstanding in seven areas: leadership; strategic planning; customer and market focus; measurement, analysis, and knowledge management; workforce focus; process management; and results. - IWAC Member, Heather Trim of People for Puget Sound, announced the start up of a new nonprofit organization, Zero Waste Seattle. Their first meeting will be held on November 19. Their focus will be to create partnerships with businesses and households to address behaviors and barriers to getting to “zero waste.”

3. Construction Dewatering Billing

KCIW is developing new procedures for collection and billing of sewer fees from dischargers of contaminated industrial stormwater (CISW) and construction dewatering wastewater. The goal is to ensure that procedures are fair and equitable across all of the local sewer agencies in the King County sewer service area.

4. Ideas Submitted by IWAC Members for Future Meetings

- Chris Arfman of Skills, Inc. suggested discussing Perfluorooctane-sulfonate (PFOS) at a future meeting. The Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) has identified and listed the compound PFOS as a persistent, bioaccumulative, toxic chemical (PBT). Ecology is planning to prepare a Chemical Action Plan in the future which will identify steps the state may take to reduce the threat of PFOS in the environment.
- Ken Gross of GM Nameplate is working on calculating his company's carbon footprint. He is using some of the calculation and tracking tools put out by Climate Registry and the Seattle Climate Partnership. He suggested that other IWAC members interested in working on carbon footprint calculations for their respective company or agency could meet together as a sub-group to help each other. Jed Rusyniak expressed interest in working with Ken.
- Mark LaFata of Aerojet-General Corp. suggested that we contact the Pacific Northwest Chapter of the Academy of Hazardous Materials Managers (PNWC-AHMM) for information about recent speakers and presentations at their meetings. These speakers may be willing to give a presentation to IWAC at a future meeting.

5. Recycling Efforts at Coca-Cola Bottling Facility in Bellevue – Presentation and Tour

Darin Croston, Plant Manager of the Coca-Cola Bottling facility in Bellevue gave a presentation showing how he and his staff are working with Weyerhaeuser Recycling Program with a goal to achieve 100 percent recycled waste at their facility. The facility has implemented several recycling strategies and has reached 99.8 percent recycled waste. After the presentation, Jed Rusyniak of Coca-Cola gave meeting attendees a tour of the facility.
