

Protecting the Duwamish Waterway is good business. You can help keep the Waterway clean.



Do

Do store chemicals and other materials under cover with secondary containment.



Don't

Don't store chemicals and materials outside near drains that can pollute stormwater.



Do keep outdoor areas well maintained.



Don't allow debris, dirt, leaks and spills in outdoor areas to reach drains or sewers.



Do make sure onsite grease traps and oil/water separators are regularly maintained so they work well.



Don't allow grease and oil to bypass onsite treatment systems. Grease can clog the sanitary sewer system and create backup problems. Oil and other pollutants that reach the storm drain system are bad for the environment.



Do clean up spills. Maintain a spill plan and train employees to use it.



Don't allow spills to reach storm drains.



Do regularly maintain onsite drainage facilities.



Don't allow buildup of material in onsite drainage facilities.
