It was so moved, seconded, and the September Minutes were approved as amended.

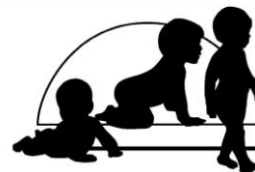
UNIVERSAL SCREENING GRANT

Katherine A. TeKolste, M.D., is a developmental pediatrician and associate clinical professor of pediatrics at the University of Washington. Dr. TeKolste works in collaboration with the Washington State Department of Health and the Center on Human Development and Disability to develop Child Health Notes and the Critical Elements of Care for Low Birth Weight Neonatal Intensive Care Unit graduates to deliver practical information and resources for health care providers on various health

conditions impacting children and their families. She is the project director of the Adolescent Health Transition Project with the Washington State Department of Health to improve transitions for adolescents with disabilities/chronic illnesses.

Katherine also reported on a new federal grant received by the Children with Special Health Care Needs Program entitled, "Great MINDS – Medical Homes Include Developmental Screening" will build on these efforts and broaden the focus to all children and not primarily those with autism spectrum disorders.

LEAD AGENCY REPORT

STATE INTERAGENCY COORDINATING COUNCIL

Magan provided overviews of the following topics:

- A draft version of the Fast Facts About Washington's Early Learning Guidelines Redesign (formerly known as the Washington State Early Learning and Development Benchmarks). The guidelines provide support for school readiness at the state, regional, and local level.
- The release of the Executive Summary of the Early Support for Infants and Toddlers (ESIT) Cost Study. The objective of the cost study include the following:

- Document the service delivery system and administrative structures in place across Washington State at the local level;
 - Determine the costs and revenues available for providing Part C early intervention services across Washington State; and
 - Help Early Support for Infants and Toddlers identify and recommend funding policies that will lead to a more sustainable, equitable, and cost effective financial system statewide.
- The release of the Recommended Practice Guidelines for Toddlers with or who are suspected to have Autism Spectrum Disorder. The guidelines were developed in collaboration between ESIT and the Hearing Center with the use of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funds.

2012 CONTRACT UPDATE

Magan presented the 2012 contract updates for the state interagency agreement between the State of Washington Department of Early Learning and King County Department of Community and Human Services. The purpose of the contract is to ensure a local system for the provision of IDEA, Part C, Early Intervention Services, for infants and toddlers, birth to three, with disabilities and/or developmental delays, and their families, throughout Washington State's geographic area of King County.

Magan also distributed the DEL/ESIT contract for the committee to review.

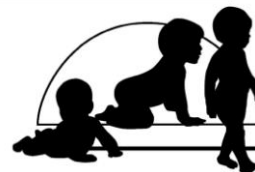
