

ARE YOU COVERED?

Confidential Application for the Early Intervention Program

Please keep sheets "1" and "2" for reference.

The Early Intervention Program (EIP) helps eligible persons who live in Washington get health care for their EIP as part of the Washington State Department of Health. EIP is not an insurance. EIP is an assistance program that helps pay for a variety of EIP-related services including health insurance premium assistance.

Prescription Medication
 For covered classes, EIP pays for medication on one beneficiary. For others with insurance, we may support the medication on one beneficiary. Classes may be used for a second class. Cost share amounts are based on the amount paid.

Medical Care
 The medical classes, EIP pays for hospital EIP-related services such as tests, for others with insurance, EIP pays for EIP-related services during covered periods that are not covered by other insurance. Classes may be used for a second class. Cost share amounts are based on the amount paid.

Health Care
 EIP pays for health care services for children who are not covered during covered periods or are covered by other insurance. Health-related services are covered up to \$1,500 per calendar year. Classes may be used for a second class.

How do you apply?

- Submit all required documents.

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How will we process your application?

- If your application is complete, we will send you an eligibility letter. Your eligibility will begin on the date of your application or the date of your enrollment. If you are not eligible, we will not process your application.
- If your application is not complete, we will send you a letter telling you what is missing. An incomplete application will delay your eligibility start.
- Your application is subject to audit. If we find you are ineligible, we will stop your eligibility and send you a notice of termination.

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Eligible Individuals:
 Early Intervention Program (EIP), Washington State's Affordable Prescription Drug Program (APDP) or Washington State's Health Insurance Premium Fund (HIPF). EIP is funded by the State and Federal dollars to assist eligible citizens access health-related services and services to improve their health. Our website information is listed below.

Program Health Insurance Program (HIPF): EIP connects with a health insurance program (HIPF) to provide health insurance and other services with additional benefits such as HIPF or COBRA. The website URL is www.wa.gov. HIPF allows you to maintain the Washington Health Insurance Program (HIPF). EIP may also be able to pay for approved individual or employer-sponsored insurance plans. Washington State Health Insurance Fund (HIPF): HIPF is Washington State's high-risk pool program. HIPF allows you to qualify for this insurance when an individual insurance company will not cover you. EIP will pay the premium through HIPF.  EIP will pay for the cost of the services on the other side of this page. However, you may also have to complete an application with BSNB, BSNB, Social Security Administration and/or HIPF.

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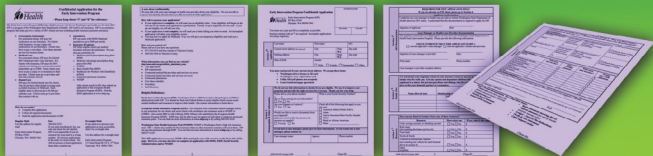
Don't let your EIP expire. Renew every year. Talk to your case manager.

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The Early Intervention Program (EIP) is Washington State's AIDS Drug Assistance Program. This program helps eligible people pay for HIV-related medications, HIV medical care and dental services, as well as health insurance premiums through EHIP.

If you are enrolled in EIP, you need to renew every year. If you miss renewing on time, you will lose EIP coverage until you reapply. This delay can make it hard for you to fill your prescriptions, see your doctor, keep your insurance and stay healthy. Life is complicated enough when you have HIV. Keep it from getting more complicated. Renew on time.

EIP will send you a renewal notice about six weeks before your eligibility ends, so make sure to tell them when your address changes.
