

# KING COUNTY LANDMARKS COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES

**CALL TO ORDER:** Vice Chair Hudson called the meeting to order at 4:55 pm. She presented Tom Hitzroth, former Commission Chair, with a boutonniere consisting of pink and orange flowers.
