Juvenile Detention Intake Criteria*

- I. Juveniles under age 8 will not be detained.
- II. New Offense: See reverse for eligible offenses
- III. Warrants: All active warrants may be presented to detention. Some warrants may be PR'd. (8AM-5PM to verify warrants only call 206-205-9430)
- IV. History: If youth has a pending (filed on) matter, was released from detention in the past 30 days, or had a felony adjudication in the last 3 months.
- V. Other Criteria: Administrative Holds or when the identification of the youth is uncertain
- VI. Detain Override: A youth who does not meet any of the previous criteria may be detained under certain specified circumstances. Call Screening Unit for more information.

Call King County Juvenile Probation Screening Unit at 206-205-9595 to determine if a youth is eligible for detention prior to transporting youth.

KING COUNTY YOUTH CRISIS RESOURCE CARD

FOR IMMEDIATE CRISIS INTERVENTION:

Children's Crisis Outreach Response System (CCORS) - In Home Service (206) 461-3222 or 866-427-4747 (Call 24/7)

CCORS provides urgent crisis outreach to children and families in crisis due to emotional or behavioral problems and/or family conflict. Outreach occurs in the family home or other community location to provide intensive stabilization, de-escalation, and supports to help families achieve stability and prevent future crises.

Spruce Street Inn - Secure Crisis Res. Ctr. (206) 587-0992 (Call 24/7)

Shelter: 1102 E. Spruce St., Seattle WA

Placement is limited to Law Enforcement referrals of youth age 12-17 who are considered to be in dangerous circumstances (given age, location and time of day) or are a reported runaway/missing person and have no active warrants, do not need immediate medical and/or psychiatric attention and cannot be returned home. Program staff work on reunification or securing a new placement for youth. Families can receive referrals and free counseling services.

Parents or youth (12-17) may request FRS to resolve family conflict. Services are voluntary & may include a family assessment and crisis counseling. Parents must contact FRS before filing an ARY/CHINS petition. Brief out-of-home placement is possible in very critical situations.

STEP-UP (Domestic Violence Program) (206) 296-7841 (Call Mon, Thu, Fri 8:30-5; Tue, Wed 12-4) - Multiple Locations

A program for teens who are violent with family members; parent/caretaker and teen attend program together; parents/caretakers can call for safety planning and support over the phone.
