
Sewer system maintenance in your neighborhood the week of July 18

As part of the Fremont Siphon Sewer Project, King County is performing maintenance work on the south end of the Fremont Siphon -- located in West Ewing Mini Park in Queen Anne -- during the week of July 18.

Work is expected to begin on Monday, July 18, and continue for several days. Work hours are expected to be from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. but may change if needed. Equipment will remain overnight during this work and active work areas will be fenced off for safety.

In the Fremont neighborhood, intermittent work will occur near 2nd Avenue NW and NW Canal Street. Equipment is not expected to impact 2nd Avenue NW, NW Canal Street, or the Burke-Gilman trail. There will be heavy equipment, noise, dust, and odor from the sewer system.

In the Queen Anne neighborhood, active maintenance work will occur on the south end of the Fremont Siphon, located in West Ewing Mini Park north of 3rd Avenue W and W Ewing Street. Equipment is not expected to impact parking lot access at West Ewing Mini Park. There will be heavy equipment, construction noise, dust, and odor from the sewer system.



The Fremont Siphon, a critical conveyance line carrying wastewater, is located under the Lake Washington Ship Canal, west of the Fremont Bridge. King County is evaluating this nearly 100-year-old siphon for rehabilitation or replacement. The preferred alternative has been selected and construction is anticipated to begin in 2014.

On the project area map at left, the red lines represent both the existing Fremont Siphon and existing pipes conveying flows to and from the siphon. The black stars indicate the approximate work areas for maintenance work the week of July 18.
