



## **King Street Odor Control Project Update - February 12, 2009**

### **South King Street Repaved Tomorrow - Friday, Feb. 13**

*No access to parking spaces along southern border of King Street Center for most of the day*

King County's contractor for the King Street Odor Control project will repave portions of South King Street between Second Avenue South and King Street Station on Friday, Feb. 13.

Traffic will be reduced to one lane between King Street Center and King Street Station. Parking spaces --including carpool parking spaces-- along the southern border of King Street Center will be inaccessible all day. Access into King Street Center will be maintained at all times, but may be delayed briefly to allow for the safe relocation of repaving equipment and personnel.

Crews will block off access to the parking areas and begin setting up traffic control at 5:00 a.m. Work will continue through midday and the area will remain off limits through the evening. South King Street and the parking areas will be returned to full service by Saturday, February, 14.

Traffic control personnel will be on site to ease congestion around the work area.

### **What to expect**

- Paving equipment and personnel working in the westbound lane and parking areas along the southern border of King Street Center between King Street Station and Second Avenue South.
- Traffic reduced to one lane between King Street station and Second Avenue South.
- Flaggers will be stationed at each end of the work zone to ease congestion.

King County is committed to being a good neighbor during construction. The project team will continue to work with community members to minimize disruptions to the daily lives of those living and working near the construction zone.
