

KING STREET ODOR CONTROL PROJECT MAY 2009

Project Update, May 5, 2009

Final stages of major above ground construction activities

King County's contractor will begin the final stages of above ground construction activities on the King Street Odor Control facility. During the month of May, crews will be installing the odor control tank, setting the exhaust stack, pouring concrete, and completing associated masonry work on the facility. The work will occur weekdays from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m. Crews may also work on Saturday, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. if necessary.

Beginning sometime in June, the remaining mechanical and electrical construction activities will take place below ground and should minimize construction impacts in the area for the remainder of the project. The project is expected to be completed late summer/early fall 2009.

Community members can expect increased noise from construction activities during work hours. To protect public safety, pedestrians should remain alert and cautious when passing near the construction zone. All access into the construction zone should be coordinated with King County's project team in advance.

What to Expect

- Increased noise and activity in the construction zone between King Street Station and the Weller Street Bridge starting the week of May 4 from 7 a.m. 5 p.m.
- Large cranes, concrete mixing trucks, and additional construction equipment and crews working on site.
- Temporary disruption in traffic flow at South King Street and Second Avenue.

King County is committed to being a good neighbor during construction. The project team will continue to work with community members to minimize disruptions to the daily lives of those living and working near the construction zone.
