

Red crane replacement scheduled to begin Saturday, Feb. 13

Now that much of the largest infrastructure is in place, King County's contractor is preparing to remove and replace the large red crane on the Murray CSO Control Project site. The new crane will have better mobility and will be used to move smaller equipment and materials around the site. When extended, the new crane will be similar in height to the red crane but the arm can be retracted to a lower height when the crane is not in use.

Removal of the red crane is scheduled for Saturday, Feb. 13. King County's contractor will use another temporary crane to disassemble the red crane into smaller pieces. Trucks will be used to transport each piece off of the project site. **Beach Dr. S.W. will be limited to one lane during crane removal. Increased truck traffic, congestion, and delays of up to 15 minutes are expected.**

The replacement crane will be delivered to the site as early as the week of Feb. 15. The new crane will be fully assembled and ready to use upon arrival.



The large red crane will be removed on Feb. 13.

What to expect during crane removal:

- Disassembly of the crane between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Saturday, Feb. 13
- East lane of Beach Dr. S.W. closed during work
- No parking on Lincoln Park Way S.W. between Murray Ave S.W. and Beach Dr. S.W.
- Flaggers directing traffic along Beach Dr. S.W. and at the intersection of Beach Dr. S.W. and Lincoln Park Way S.W.
- Increased truck traffic, congestion, and delays of up to 15 minutes
- Trucks transporting pieces of the crane will use the designated haul route, entering the site from Lincoln Park Way S.W. and leaving the site on 48th Ave S.W.
