Restoration begins. Connection between sewer lines and underground storage tank nearing completion

Roadway and sidewalk restoration

King County's contractor for the Murray CSO Control Project has begun restoration of the roadway at the intersection of 48th Ave. S.W., Beach Dr. S.W. and Lincoln Park Way S.W. For the remainder of the project, crews will be working intermittently in the intersection and nearby streets to replace sections of the roadway and sidewalk. Crews will use saws, jackhammers, excavators, and concrete trucks to complete this work.

Increased truck traffic and intermittent lane and sidewalk closures are expected, but flaggers will maintain two-way traffic during lane closures. Expect variable road conditions, including loose gravel, pavement cuts, uneven surfaces, and steel plates. ***Cyclists should use extreme caution when traveling near the project area.*** The County will be in contact with the community throughout restoration to share information about expected impacts and milestones.



Steel plates or gravel may be used to cover restoration areas outside of normal work hours.

Underground storage tank and sewer line connection

The County's contractor is nearing completion of the connection between the underground storage tank, 5-foot-wide sewer line, and local sewer line. A temporary bypass system was used to maintain sewer service to the neighborhood when work on the connection pipe began in July. To complete the connection, the contractor will need to use the temporary system again.

Starting the week of September 12, a pump from the temporary system will run continuously for five days (day and night) to move flows around the work zone. Odors may be more noticeable while the pump is running. Air quality will be monitored to ensure safe conditions. A representative from the contractor will be on site at all times to monitor the pump.

What to expect:

- Work to occur on weekdays from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. and on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- Pumps running continuously while the temporary bypass system is in use
- Periods of increased noise and noticeable odors
- Intermittent lane and sidewalk closures
- Variable road conditions on sections of Beach Dr. S.W., 48th Ave. S.W., and Lincoln Park Way S.W.
- Backfilling to continue around the facility building
- Regular project work to continue on the project site and in Lowman Beach Park
