July Update: Underground fuel storage tanks removal

King County's contractor Titan Earthwork finished breaking down remaining foundations over the past few weeks. Crews will continue below-ground demolition activities in the coming weeks. These activities will prepare the site for construction.

Upcoming activities

- Removing underground fuel storage tanks, fuel lines, and fuel pumps
- Demolishing the fuel island from the former gas station
- Continuing to locate underground utilities by drilling shallow holes on site
- Continuing to run dewatering and water treatment equipment
- Continuing to remove contaminated soil from the site

King County is dedicated to protecting the public's health and safety during construction activities. The County will continue to maintain safe air and water quality through construction practices the contractor is required to use. Building materials and contaminated soil will be disposed of following local, state, and federal regulations.

What to expect

- Work on weekdays from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m.; you will be notified in advance if work will occur on nights/weekends
- Large trucks and equipment moving in and out of the site
- Increased noise while structures are removed and demolished
- You may hear noise close to the site from the dewatering pumps and generator, running 24/7
- Employment of best management practices to protect public health and the environment



To prepare for construction, crews will demolish the fuel island.



Trucks and equipment will access the treatment station site from Fourth Avenue South.
