Update: November 2017

Dewatering equipment installation starting November 13, 2017

King County crews will install dewatering equipment at the Vashon Bunker Trail (BT) 1 and 2 (see map below) starting Monday, November 13. Equipment includes baker tanks to hold excess water, a diesel-powered pump and a generator that will run 24/7 while the work is being completed. No changes are expected to traffic, and one lane will remain closed between BT1 and BT3 along 103 Avenue SW.

What you can expect during construction

- Flaggers will help move traffic through the work site
- One lane closed along 103rd Avenue SW between BT1 and BT3 work sites
- No lane closure at BT4 work site
- Interruption to sewer services not anticipated
- Coordination with Washington State
 Department of Transportation to minimize impact to the ferry schedule
- Access at all times for ferry traffic, emergency vehicles, school buses, and neighborhood residents
- Work crew, trucks, and drilling equipment in the street and public right-of-way on the curb and sidewalk
- Increased noise on site
- Work hours are weekdays between 7 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. No work on holidays
