Vashon pump stations temporary sewer discharge to manhole at the end of 96th place SW

King County crews began working in your neighborhood to replace aging equipment and structures at the Vashon Bunker Trail (BT) pump stations starting in September 2017. King County notified the neighborhood and the Vashon Ferry by mail, blog and web posting prior to the start of the construction (see attached flier). During construction, work crews discovered a partial blockage in a sewer pipe which connects to the influent splitter box on the north side of the Vashon Treatment Plant. The blockage affects normal flow through the sewer pipe. Vashon Sewer District has given the County permission to temporarily discharge the sewage to the manhole located at the end of 96th Place SW. This manhole sends sewage to the Vashon treatment Plant

for further treatment. The temporary discharge is expected to last for approximately three months.

What you can expect during construction

- Flaggers will help move traffic through the work site
- Work crew and pump trucks by the manhole
- Interruption to sewer services not anticipated
- Access at all times for emergency vehicles, school buses, and neighborhood residents
- Increased truck noise on site
- Work hours are weekdays between 7 a.m. and
 5:30 p.m. No work on holidays
