
### BACKGROUND

- October 2012: WADOC/King County 2<sup>nd</sup> Chance Planning Grant Awarded
  - Culled WADOC and King County existing reentry reports to identify already-established priorities
  - Reviewed best practices research
  - Gap analysis of WADOC and King County reentry services
  - Task Force provided input on grant focus areas:
    - Multidisciplinary, jurisdiction-wide strategies
    - Client-focused case management model
    - Increased utilization of existing community resources

# **CURRENT GRANT**

- October 2013: WADOC/King County 2<sup>nd</sup> Chance Demonstration Grant Awarded
- To fund development and implementation of a jointjurisdictional reentry pilot initiative to improve reentry planning and transitional services for persons currently confined in prison or jail who:
  - Must be under DOC supervision
  - Assessed as high risk to recidivate (using the WADOC's Static Risk Assessment)
  - Moderate to high housing need
  - Moderate to high mental health and/or chemical dependency needs
- \$750,000 Grant with a \$750,000 Match (secured in late 2014)

### WORK PLAN: GUIDING PRINCIPLES

#### Areas of Focus

- Align State and County policies with evidence-based practices
- Systemic coordination of government and community providers serving shared clients
- Operationalize a team-based continuum of care case management pilot model that results in comprehensive frontline-level practices that better support participants

#### Budget priorities

- At least 40% of funds to support community providers
- Extend DOC housing vouchers for participants
- DOC Transition Specialist(s) located in KC jails

### SUB-WORKGROUPS

- Community Transition and Pre-Release Planning Sub-Workgroup
  - Develop a team-based continuum of care case management pilot process that begins at sentencing and continues through release
- Information Sharing Sub-Workgroup
  - Develop procedures for obtaining, protecting and sharing pilot participant information
- Performance Measures Sub-Workgroup
  - Identify outcome and performance measures for the pilot
- A sub-workgroup focused on aftercare will be convened following completion of first sub-workgroup reports

## **CURRENT STATE OF PILOT DEVELOPMENT**

#### Community Transition

- Identified State, County and community partners
- Developing pre-release planning template and processes
- Developing release procedures and handoffs

#### Information Sharing

- Mapped required data and data locations
- Developing mechanisms and processes for sharing client data
- Identifying legal statutes and procedural requirements governing data sharing and protection

#### Performance Measurement

- Identified performance measurement definitions
- Created draft performance measurement database

### **NEXT STEPS**

- Complete sub-workgroup reports
- Develop final implementation plan and re-convene Task Force
  - Full operational procedures and process map
  - Performance measures and procedures
  - Required documentation (MOUs, Release of Information)
- Train staff and test procedures
- Implement and evaluate pilot
