WHICH CIVIL RIGHTS AGENCY SHOULD YOU CONTACT?

There are civil rights agencies at the federal, state and local levels that can help you. Each agency has a particular geographic "jurisdiction" or area of authority. You should contact the agency with authority to enforce fair housing laws for the property where you live or that you own. The chart below lists all of the civil rights agencies in our state and the locations of housing properties that are in their jurisdictions. These agencies provide technical assistance and training about fair housing laws.
