1. **Welcome/Let's Connect.** The meeting was called to order by the Honorable David Baker at 12:36pm; there was not a quorum. Consultant Ann Macfarlane of Jurassic Parliament guided an icebreaker exercise.
2. **Review of Minutes.** Since there was not a quorum, approval of previous minutes is tabled until March.
3. **Guest Speaker.** Matias Valenzuela, Director, King County Equity & Social Justice guided a discussion of King County's programs to build equity and opportunity, including an overview of demographic information that shed light in inequities around the county. Deborah Jacobs mentioned some ways that the committee could fulfill its charge to advise the Sheriff's Office and County Council on ESJ issues, including reporting on opportunities

and obstacles to diversity in recruitment and hiring, reviewing training relevant to deputies' cultural competencies, and developing and conducting citizen satisfaction surveys.

4. Update on OLEO's Progress

- a) **OLEO Ordinance** – Deborah Jacobs reported on the posture of OLEO's ordinance. She indicated that the County Council members are deciding how they want to proceed in directing collective bargaining on OLEO's behalf, either by passing an ordinance or passing a labor policy.

5. Role of the Committee

Consultant Ann Macfarlane facilitated a conversation about actual committee name and the role of the committee and received feedback. The conversation will continue in March.
