The education and community center will be open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday until the end of the year. Tours will be offered on Mondays.

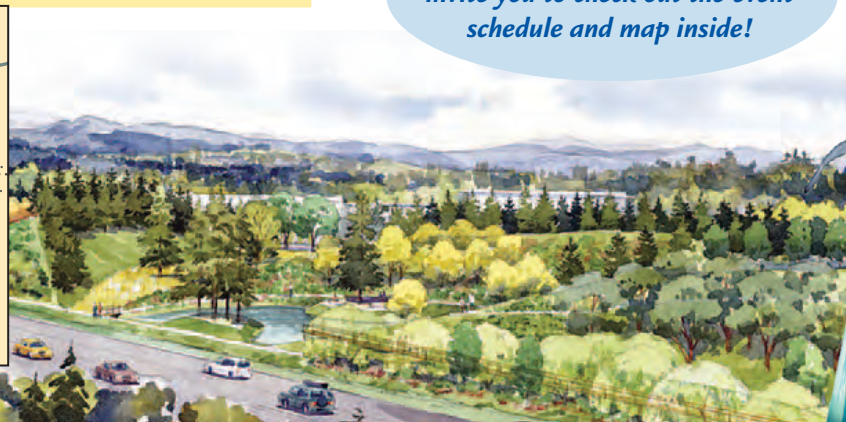

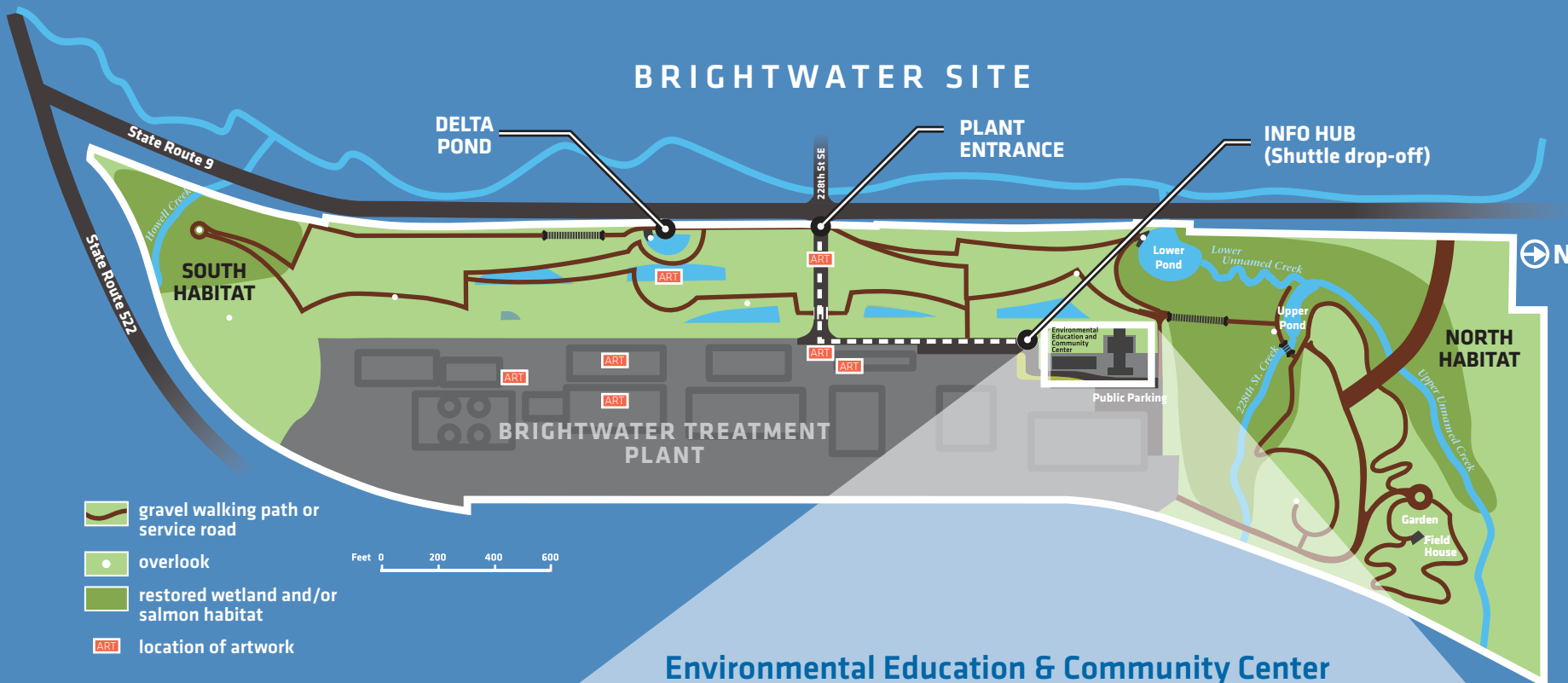

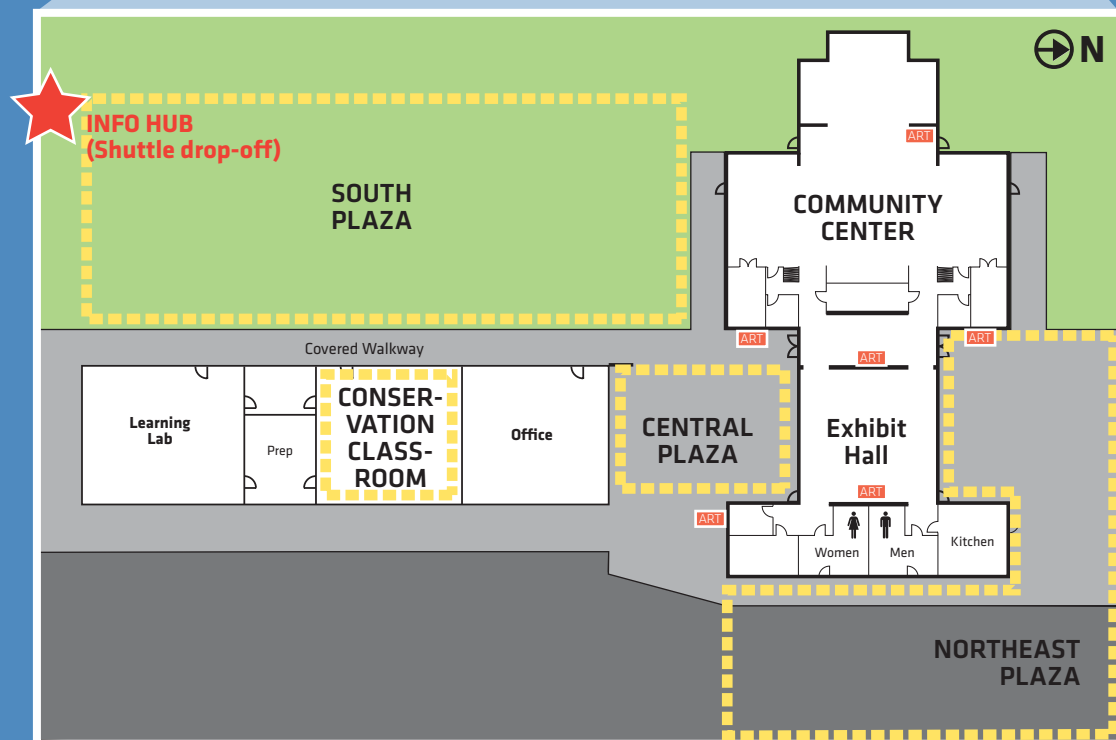
