Summary of Engineering and Planning (E&P) Subcommittee January 5, 2017 Meeting for MWPAAC General Meeting on January 25, 2017

Conveyance System Improvement (CSI) Program Update

King County staff presented a table recommending the initial prioritization of the 2017 CSI projects. Eight projects are considered high priority, with a recommendation to proceed with design and construction within the next 10 years. Ten projects are considered medium priority, with plans to begin design after 2025, and the remaining 23 projects are longer-term projects scheduled for implementation following completion of the high- and medium-priority projects. The project prioritization is based primarily on the existing conveyance facilities' ability to carry the design flows and/or significant operations/maintenance issues. King County staff has discussed the projects with the individual jurisdictions affected by the proposed projects.

The CSI Program Update draft report is scheduled to be completed this spring and will be available to MWPAAC members. Additional presentations on the CSI Program Update are scheduled for the March 2017 E&P meeting.

E&P 2017 Work Plan

Each year, E&P works with King County staff to identify subjects for discussion at the E&P Subcommittee meetings. This year's work plan includes the infiltration/inflow reduction concepts evaluation, information about the Industrial Waste Program's permitting guidelines, updates on projects (major capital projects and the Combined Sewer Overflow projects), planning for the decennial flow monitoring program in 2019-2020, discussion of emerging technologies and products, and joint meetings with the Rates and Finance Subcommittee (e.g., resiliency and recovery program).

Note that some of the topics that E&P will be discussing this year, particularly the I/I Reduction Concepts, will require longer meetings.
