Welcome

King County's contractor for the Magnolia Conveyance Project will be installing another pipe to connect to the Magnolia Wet Weather Facility. The underground storage tank, located in Smith Cove Park, is designed to store excess flows of stormwater and wastewater in large storms, and reduce combined sewer overflows (CSOs) to the Puget Sound. After storms, stored flows are sent to the West Point Treatment Plant in Discovery Park.

The existing pipe was discovered to have a break far below West Galer Street in the area of Thorndyke Avenue West. Over the next several months, the contractor plans to assemble and pull another pipeline through the existing pipe corridor.




Construction

Crews will work in Smith Cove Park and on 32nd Avenue West to install another pipeline into the existing pipe corridor. The pipe will be assembled on 32nd Avenue West.


King County's contractor will install the new pipe using a method called pipe bursting. Pipe bursting uses a series of tools to pull a pipe through the existing pipeline from one end to the other (shown in the graphic and diagram). The pipe cutter tool breaks and expands the existing pipe. This project will use a pipe made of high density polyethylene (HDPE).

The pipe will be pulled from the diversion structure on 32nd Avenue West to the exit point in Smith Cove Park using the same path as the current pipe. King County's project team will be working closely with project neighbors throughout construction to provide advanced notice of activities and address questions and concerns.


The steps in the pipe bursting process.

Activities and Schedule



What to expect - Smith **Cove Park**

Construction began in December 2017

- Contractor mobilized to the site in August 2017
- · Crews will excavate the exit pit in Smith Cove Park
- Excavation will occur at the base of the hill
- A drill rig will be used to pull the pipeline from 32nd Avenue West to Smith Cove Park
- · The contractor will restore the work area

What to expect:

- King County's contractor is expected to occupy the work area through June 2018
- · Public access to the north end of the Smith Cove athletic field will be maintained
- Increased noise, and construction activity in Smith Cove Park
- · Construction equipment such as drilling rigs, trucks, mud plants, cranes and excavators will be located at the worksite
- · Occasional short delays for deliveries on 23rd Avenue West access to businesses will be maintained
- Traffic control personnel and signs to help traffic and trail users pass by the work area safely

What to expect - 32nd Avenue West

Construction begins January 2018

Crews will:

- Mobilize equipment to 32nd Avenue West
- Excavate a pit to access the upper end of the existing pipe
- Lay out and assemble pipe along 32nd Avenue West
- Pull another pipe through existing pipeline
- Restore diversion structure
- Restore work area

What to expect:

- Increased noise and construction activity along 32nd Avenue West
- · Crews, material and equipment, including a small drill rig, in 32nd Avenue West right-of-way
- · Temporary delays and one-lane road
- Road closed for up to four days during pipe pull
- · Occasional traffic delays
- Traffic control personnel and signs to help traffic, pedestrians and cyclists pass by the work area safely



Accessing the diversion structure on 32nd Avenue West will reduce traffic to one lane.
