Voter registration and election information



Requirements

To register to vote in Washington, you must be:

- · A citizen of the United States;
- · A legal resident of Washington State;
- At least 18 years old by Election Day;
- Not under Department of Corrections supervision for a Washington felony conviction; and
- · Not disqualified from voting due to a court order.

How to register

Online

You can register or update your registration online at VoteWA.gov — you'll need a Washington State Driver License or ID. Make sure you register online by the October 26 deadline for the November 3 General and Special Election.

By mail

Download and print a registration form from www.kingcounty.gov/elections to register or update your registration and mail it to our office by the October 26 deadline for the November 3 General and Special Election.

In person

You can register in person through November 3, Election Day at a vote center. For more information on locations and hours of vote centers, visit www.kingcounty.gov/elections.

Ballot information

On Tuesday, November 3, 2020 in King County, Washington, there will be held a General and Special Election conducted entirely by mail.

Replacement ballot

Call King County Elections to obtain a replacement ballot if your original ballot packet is lost, spoiled, or destroyed.

Keep your voter registration current

Update your registration if you have moved or changed your name, or if your signature has changed. Simply update your information online or submit a new registration form by October 26 for the General Election or visit us in person through November 3, Election Day at one of the vote centers listed on the King County Elections website.
