




Start with WHY

Residents of West Bellevue can expect to live about 10 years longer than those of South Auburn.


LIFE EXPECTANCY (By county health-reporting area)





Mission Statement

• The mission of the Auburn Prevention Coalition is to reduce, prevent, and eliminate underage drug and alcohol use by engaging, educating, and empowering all members of our multicultural community.



Who We Are

- The Auburn Prevention Coalition is a Community Prevention and Wellness Initiative (CPWI) coalition
- CPWI is a partnership of state agencies (DBHR), counties (King County), schools (Auburn School District), and prevention coalitions (Auburn Prevention Coalition).
- CPWI is funded and administered by Washington State Department of Social and Health Services, Behavioral Health and Service Integration Administration, Division of Behavioral Health and Recovery (DBHR), through a grant from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA).
- In addition, the school district receives additional support of a Prevention Intervention Specialist through the Puget Sound Education Service District (PSESD) that is funded by the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI).

Why Auburn?

- Auburn was identified to be a CPWI community due to experiencing high levels of underage drinking, crime, school drop-out, and unemployment.
- Auburn was selected not only for these identified factors, but also because of Auburn's readiness to address these factors.

- Any Underage Drinking
 - (HYS 2016 30-day use) 8th=16% [WA=8%]
 - $10^{\text{th}} = 22\% [WA = 8\%]$
- Underage Marijuana Use
 - (HYS 2016)
 - 8th=10% [WA=6%]
 - 10th=23% [WA=17%]

Mental Health

- (HYS 2016 % of Attempted Suicide)
- 8th=10% [WA=8%]
- 10th=15% [WA=10%]

Youth Delinquency

- (HYS 2016 % of gang membership)
- 8th=10% [WA=5%]
- 10th=15% [WA=10%]




EDUCATE








EMPOWER
