1	A RESOLUTION supporting recommendations and a
2	strategic and operational plan for HIV prevention in King
3	County.
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5	WHEREAS, HIV continues to be a significant threat to the public's health and the
6	number of new cases each year in King County is not decreasing, and
7	WHEREAS, the prevalence of HIV within the gay and bisexual community
8	remains high (around 14-16%), and other minority groups are also disproportionately
9	affected by HIV, and
10	WHEREAS, the Board of Health established the HIV/AIDS Committee to
11	identify and consider actions that the Board could take to improve King County's
12	HIV/AIDS prevention efforts, and
13	WHEREAS, the HIV/AIDS Committee held a series of meetings with
14	stakeholders to gather information about strategies to reduce the transmission of HIV,
15	effective ways to reach specific at-risk groups, and how current prevention programs,
16	activities, and messages could be more effective, and

17	WHEREAS, after considering input from stakeholders, the HIV/AIDS Committee
18	developed recommendations for the Board of Health enhance and promote King
19	County's HIV/AIDS prevention efforts, and
20	WHEREAS, Public Health – Seattle & King County's HIV/AIDS Program
21	developed a Strategic and Operational Plan for HIV Prevention in King County that
22	incorporated the HIV/AIDS Committee's recommendations, including a communitywide
23	goal for reducing the number of HIV cases and setting a strategy for how to achieve that
24	goal, and
25	WHEREAS, the HIV/AIDS Committee supports the Strategic and Operational
26	Plan for HIV Prevention in King County;
27	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Health of King
28	County:
29	A. The Board of Health commends the HIV/AIDS Committee for their work, all
30	of the stakeholders that participated in the process, and Public Health-Seattle & King
31	County for responding and developing the Strategic and Operational Plan for HIV
32	Prevention in King County; and
33	B. The Board of Health calls upon high-risk groups, organizations working to
34	prevent HIV/AIDS, and the broader community to:
35	1. Call attention to the ongoing HIV/AIDS crisis and the continuing
36	unacceptably high rates of HIV transmission;
37	2. Identify effective prevention strategies; and
38	3. Take individual and collective actions to prevent the spread of HIV; and

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39	C. The Board of Health endorses and adopts the HIV/AIDS Committee's Report
40	and Recommendations; and
41	D. The Board of Health endorses the Strategic and Operational Plan for HIV
42	Prevention in King County.
