1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 1:37 p.m. by Chair Julia Patterson.

2. Roll Call

3. Announcement of Any Alternates Serving in Place of Regular Members

There were no alternates serving in place of regular members in attendance at the meeting.

4. Approval of Minutes of December 13, 2007

Boardmember Hutchinson moved approval of the minutes of December 13, 2007. Boardmember Counts seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

5. Public Comments

The following person spoke:

Becki Holmes, a nutrition specialist speaking on behalf of Starbucks Coffee Company, commented on the collaborative nature of the trans fat and menu labeling implementation committee.

6. Chair's Report

The chair welcomed Boardmember Licata to the Board and asked staff members to the Board to introduce themselves. The Chair also indicated that she and Dr. Fleming had met with WASC legislative steering committee on menu labeling and possible state preemption of this issue. The

steering committee indicated that WSAC will oppose efforts to preempt local efforts on menu labeling.

7. Board Member Updates

There were no Boardmember updates.

8. <u>Director's Report</u>

Dr. Fleming announced to the Board that he had just attended the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day celebration for King County, at which a humanitarian award was given to Dr. Charissa Fotinos of the Department of Public Health. He also noted that Harborview Hospital has been awarded the Foster G. McGraw award, given by the American Hospital Association, for its innovative work. Dr. Fleming announced that the Department has been awarded a grant for \$150,000 to provide education on the Board's menu labeling efforts. Finally, the Department was asked to work with the Puget Sound Clean Air Agency in completing a health impact assessment on the health impacts of the SR 520 bridge replacement project using a new tool developed to assist policymakers in assessing major capital and other projects.

9. Administrator's Report

Ms. Uhlorn pointed out the following documents in the Board's materials: (1) a letter from the Center for Disease Control on its update its HIV/AIDS strategic plan (she noted that the King County plan is in alignment with the Department's plan); (2) a letter from the Chair and the Director to the Washington Restaurant Association; (3) King County materials on obesity prevention; and (4) a 2008 schedule of meetings. She will provide the Board with an updated roster of members after the election of officers at today's meeting.
