6. <u>Director's Report</u>

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Dr. David Fleming, Director, Department of Public Health, reported on the following: (1) Spit tobacco may be an issue in the labor negotiations for Major League Baseball. The Mariners are in favor of a change to prohibit spit tobacco at major league games. (2) A school-based health center has been created by the Seattle School District and he anticipates that this health center will become a model. (3) Food handler cards may now be obtained by taking a course and passing a test on the internet. (4) Andrew Chen, who received pediatric care at Northshore Health Center, has recently made a donation to the clinic to thank it for its care. Publicity about the donation led to other donations being made from throughout the country.
