6. Director's Report

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Dr. David Fleming, Director, Seattle-King County Department of Public Health, reported on new appointments in the Department: Cindy West as chief financial officer and Jim Fogerty as the manager of the emergency medical services program. Dr. Fleming reported that a pilot program on issuing building permits online has been a success, with over 1,700 permits issued; the program is now being expanded to include restaurant inspections. He also reported on the impacts of the earthquake and tsunami in Japan and the consensus that there will be no radiation problems here.

Legislative Update

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Jennifer Muhm, legislative affairs officer, Department of Public Health, reported on the state budget. She reported on the state's adoption of a supplemental budget for the 2009-2011 biennium, which made some cuts, but did not close the budget gap. The revenue forecasts released today showed an additional \$79.8 million for this biennium and an additional \$698.4 million, for a total gap of \$5.2 billion for the 2011-2013 biennium.

Ms. Muhm also reported on various policy bills before the state legislature, including immunization exemptions, speed limits and cigar lounges. She also indicated that legislation on secure medicine returns and tobacco regulation have died.
