Additional program guidelines for colon cancer screening: If a client has a first degree relative (parent, sibling or child) <u>diagnosed with colorectal cancer before age 60</u>, he or she should get screened 10 years younger than the relative's age at diagnosis, by colonoscopy.

In-office samples from Digital Rectal Exams (DRE) are **not acceptable** tests for fecal occult blood. Use the three sample take-home FOBT test or the take home FIT test.
