#### **Issues Discussed**

## 5/30/18 EMS Advisory Task Force meeting recap

The EMS Advisory Task Force met on 5/30/18 for a briefing on work completed thus far by the various subcommittees. They reviewed draft Financial Plans, emphasized the need for efficient communication about the Medic One system and levy, entertained the idea of running the Medic One/EMS levy at the August 2019 primary election.

## **BLS Funding**

#### Overview:

The BLS Subcommittee is tasked with determining the total level of funding that will be allocated to BLS for the span of the next levy, and how to distribute it among the BLS agencies. Although the group endorsed policies related to the BLS allocation at its 5/3/18 meeting, there are still other funding items to discuss and adopt.

#### Subcommittee discussion:

It was noted that while changes have made to the BLS allocation over the years, it still does not adequately reflect true AV and calls for service. Members also reiterated their support having the regional levy contribute funding toward MIH, and stressed that each agency be eligible to receive and use MIH funds to meet its specific needs.

#### **Decisions made**

#### BLS Allocation:

- 1. Consolidate the funding from the <u>BLS Core Services</u> regional program and the <u>BLS Training</u> and <u>OI</u> Initiative into the BLS allocation. Earmark usage for those activities in the contract.
- 2. Rebase the total allocation for the first year of the new levy span (2020) using the distribution methodology of 50% AV/ 50% call volume to more accurately reflect current assessed valuation and service levels.
- 3. Add BLS funding to ensure that agencies are "kept whole", and not negatively impacted by this first year rebase.
- 4. Distribute annual increases using on same 50%AV/50% call volume methodology (*endorsed* at the Subcommittee at its May 3, 2018 meeting).

### Mobile Integrated Healthcare (MIH):

- 5. Allocate \$4 million a year of levy funding for MIH.
- 6. Distribute the first year of MIH funding to all agencies throughout the region using the current 50% AV/ 50% call volume methodology.
- 7. Inflate each agency's funding in the subsequent years of the levy by CPI-W + 1.
- 8. Establish guidelines to create consistency around data collection, measures and program reporting.

#### **Next Steps**

Because decisions made at this meeting will impact the total levy budget, the EMS Division will distribute a revised Financial Plan reflecting these decisions for BLS Subcommittee review.
