

UDS report submission & financial measures - Governance Council update

The Uniform Data System (UDS) report is submitted annually to our Federal grantor, Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). The UDS report combines all our patient and visit information with our financial information for each calendar year. This is an update on the financial measures we reported for 2019.

The UDS report is due each year on February 15th, covering the prior calendar year. Each health center then works with a HRSA contracted UDS reviewer to finalize the report, usually by mid-March. Our 2019 report was submitted 2/13/20 and accepted by the reviewer on 2/27/20. We met our overall target of 95% of our HRSA patient target in 2019, by serving 21,723 unduplicated patients in 2019, toward our patient target of 21,852. Dropping below 95% can result in funding reductions from HRSA.

Prior year comparison reports show how our Health Center compares to State and national grantees in total, and with other homeless grantees. In general, as a public entity in an urban area with a high cost of living, we have higher costs per visit and per patient in comparison to other health centers. The table below shows these measures for 2018.
