Replaced Local Route 200 – Phase 3

Neighborhoods Served:

• Issaquah Highlands, Issaquah Transit Center, downtown Issaquah.

Summary of Proposed Changes:

- New Revised Route 203 serves North Issaquah between Issaquah Highlands and the Issaquah Transit Center.
- Revised Route 554 serves South Issaquah between Issaquah Highlands and the Issaquah Transit Center via Front Street and Gilman Boulevard.

Why is this change being proposed?

- To provide better all-day service to local, Issaquah neighborhoods.
- To provide connections from local, Issaquah neighborhoods to Link light rail, and other regional connections.

How does this respond to feedback Metro received in Phase 1 and 2?

- Issaquah to Bellevue connections.
- Wider span of service weekdays and weekends.
- Routes that better connect north and south Issaquah.

* Frequent - The bus comes every 15 minutes or less during peak periods and every 30 minutes or less during off-peak periods.

* Local – All-day bus service that does not meet the standard for frequent.
* Peak-only – The bus comes only 5-9 a.m. and 3-7 p.m. These are the times of day Metro and Sound Transit sees the most riders, usually regular commuting times, Monday through Friday.
