Revised RapidRide B Line - Phase 3

Neighborhoods Served:

 Downtown Redmond Link Station, Redmond Transit Center, Overlake, Crossroads, downtown Bellevue

Summary of Proposed Changes:

- Extend service from Redmond Transit Center to Downtown Redmond Link Station via 164th Ave NE. This extension would happen in 2024 with the opening of Downtown Redmond Station.
- Move service to 156th Ave NE between NE 24th St and NE 31st St. Routes 222, 223, and 225 instead serve this segment.

Why is this change being proposed?

- To extend the route to Downtown Redmond Link Station.
- To improve speed and reliability for the route between downtown Redmond and Crossroads.

How does this respond to feedback Metro received in Phase 1 and 2?

- More transfer opportunities so riders can travel to different local and regional destinations.
- Speed and reliability, with more direct paths on faster routes where possible.

^{*} Frequent - The bus comes every 15 minutes or less during peak periods and every 30 minutes or less during off-peak periods.

^{*}Local – All-day bus service that does not meet the standard for frequent.

^{*} Peak-only – The bus comes only 5-9 a.m. and 3-7 p.m. These are the times of day Metro and Sound Transit sees the most riders, usually regular commuting times, Monday through Friday.
