Waste Reduction and Recycling (Level One)

- Elizabeth Blackwell Elementary School achieved a recycling rate of 42 percent.
- The school established a Green Team of 65 second through fifth grade students.
- In December 2017, the school replaced disposable trays with durable trays to reduce waste produced at the school.
- To make recycling easy and convenient, collection bins were placed in visible locations in classrooms, offices, and in the staff lounge.
- Student Waste Watchers were trained to monitor cafeteria recycling stations during lunchtime to help students correctly sort their waste.
- At an all-school assembly in January 2018, the school introduced students and staff members to the King County Green Schools Program and to waste reduction and recycling practices.
- Students created posters about lunchroom recycling, presented them to classes, and then hung them in school's hallways.
- To reduce paper use, teachers used the PowerSchool site to post assignments and emailed newsletters to parents.
