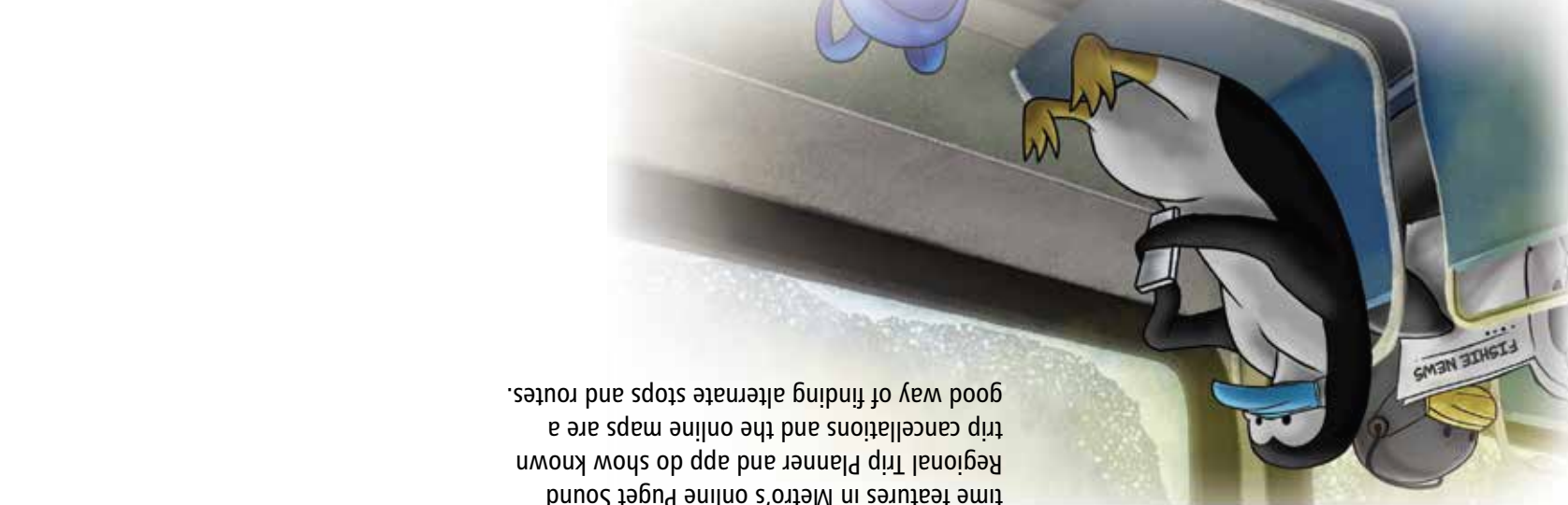

How can I stay informed?

Access riders should contact the call center on days with snow or icy conditions. The call center's phone system will provide special announcements when service is either disrupted or suspended. Access vehicles may still be available for emergency services such as life sustaining trips.

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When all Metro buses are operating on snow routes or the ESN, Metro's special Route 90 is activated to serve downtown Seattle and area hospitals. The Route 90 number does not appear on bus stop signs, however Route 90 serves all bus stops shown on the map. Route 90 provides about three trips per hour between approximately 5:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

How will I know if my bus route is affected by the weather?

MetroWinter.com provides route specific information, including snow reroutes and a map that shows how weather is affecting bus service in seven areas of King County.

At a glance you can see how weather conditions affect routes in your area based on each area's color.

- **Green** means buses are operating on their regular schedules.
- **Yellow** means some buses are running on snow routes.
- **Red** means all buses are operating on snow routes; some routes may be canceled or delayed.
- **Blue** means the Emergency Snow Network is in effect.

What happens to my bus route when it snows?

Depending on how bad the weather is, three things can happen to your bus:

1. Your bus runs on its regular schedule, or with minor service changes.
2. Your bus runs on its snow route. Some routes or certain trips might be canceled.
3. The Emergency Snow Network (ESN) may go into effect and your bus route may or may not be running. The ESN is a set of designated Metro routes that will operate if our region is broadly impacted by a severe snow event. This selection of routes is designed to serve as many riders as possible on major roadways. See the list of ESN routes on back.

Snow reroutes and the ESN are two separate ways of providing service during snow events and are dependent on the conditions and severity of the event.



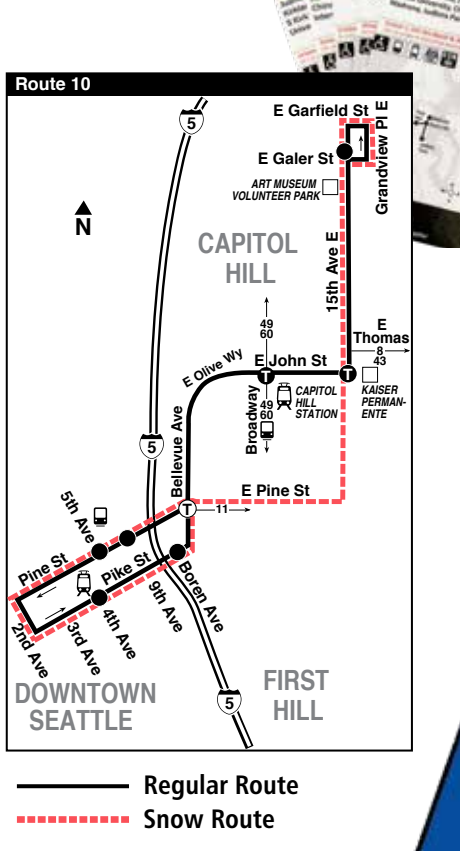
Snow, Ice and Flood Map

What is the snow route for my bus?

You can find your snow route at snowroutes.MetroWinter.com.

Printed timetables include maps of regular and snow routes. Timetables are available on buses or at libraries and transit customer information centers.

If conditions improve during the day, buses operating on their planned snow routes may return to regular or modified service.



How can I find out if my bus is on time or canceled?

When buses are not operating along their regular routes or serving their normal stops, “real-time” departure predictions at specific stops may not be reliable.

Metro recommends that you check to see if your bus is rerouted, or use a bus stop along a flat portion of a cleared major roadway, or a stop at a major transfer point, such as a park-and-ride, transit center, mall, or college.

- **Transit Alerts:** Sign up for transit alerts to get emails or texts about changes in service for routes you select. Visit signup.MetroWinter.com.
- **Text for Departures:** To find the next scheduled or predicted departures at your stop, text* your transit stop ID (on the sign at your bus stop) to this number: **62550**. Whether or not real-time information is available, canceled trips are noted in stop specific Text for Departure results.
- **Next Departures:** Estimated departure and cancellation information is shown on the Puget Sound Trip Planner and app under “Next Departures” for routes serving their regular stops.

Text your transit stop ID to 62550 for up-to-date schedule information.
