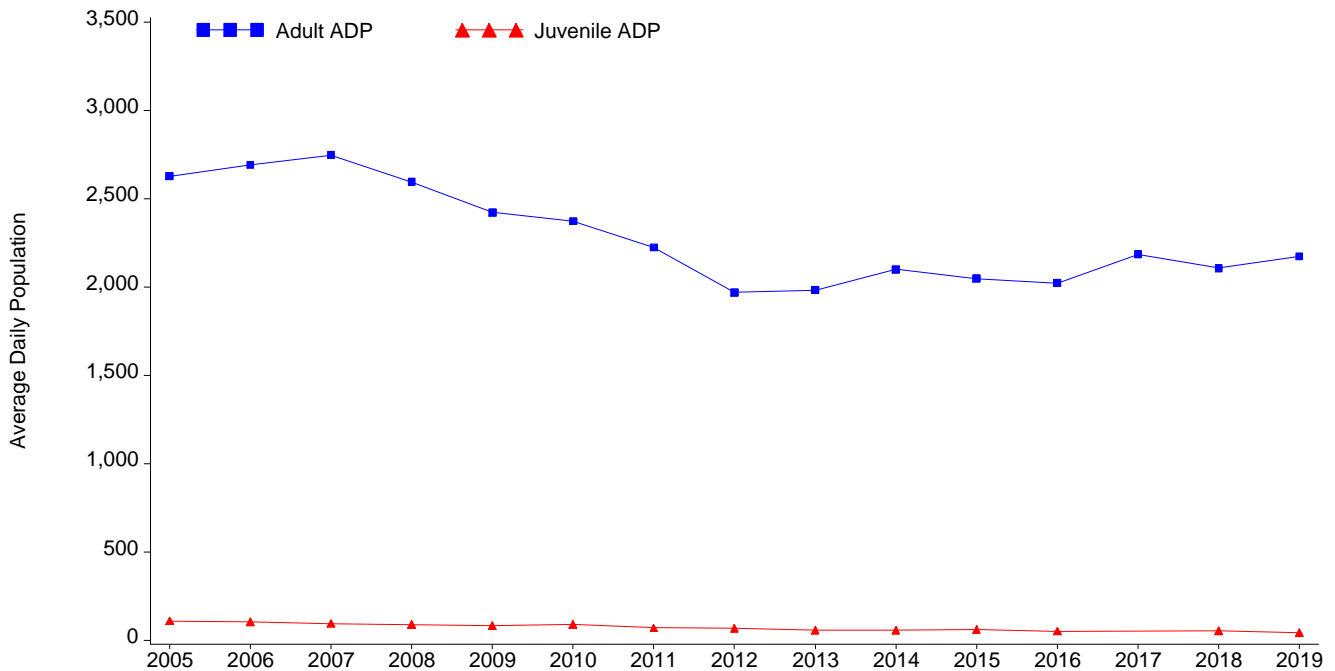

**Definitions**

- Adult Custodial Population: Inmates who are confined in the King County Correctional Facility or Regional Justice Center, and partially confined in Work Education Release or Electronic Home Detention.
- Average Daily Population (ADP): Mean number of inmates in the custodial populations on a daily basis. Total number of inmate days divided by the number of days in the time-period.
- Booking: The process of identifying, fingerprinting and gathering information about an arrested person who is being admitted to jail. Bookings are event based versus person based. In other words, there were 56,000 separate booking events in 2001 for 38,000 separate person. Some people are booked more than one time during the reporting period.
- Average Length of Stay (ALOS): The average number of days a person spends in a program or jail based upon release month.

A single booking covers all activity from the time of admission to the time of release from custody. #### Definitions

- Electronic Home Detention (EHD): A program that allows offenders to be maintained under electronic surveillance within their home and work site. This program requires random drug and alcohol testing. People on EHD are considered to be in-custody.
- Average Daily Population (ADP): Mean number of inmates in the custodial populations on a daily basis. Total number of inmate days divided by the number of days in the time-period.
- Number of Placements: The DAJD has traditionally reported the number of bookings as the measure of admission. A single booking covers all activity from the time of admission to the time of release from custody. For the purpose of data tracking, it was necessary to develop a new measure to track location movements within a booking. Placements are defined for only the custodial populations in Electronic Home Detention, Secure Detention and Work Education Release. A placement occurs the first time that a person enters a custodial population, but is only counted once in a booking for each of the three populations. - Work/Education Release (WER): A custodial community corrections program operated by DAJD that allows inmates to be released from custody in order to go to work and/or school. When they are not at work and/or school, the inmates are in-custody.
- Average Daily Population (ADP): Mean number of inmates in the custodial populations on a daily basis. Total number of inmate days divided by the number of days in the time-period.
- Number of Placements: The DAJD has traditionally reported the number of bookings as the measure of admission. A single booking covers all activity from the time of admission to the time of release from custody. For the purpose of data tracking, it was necessary to develop a new measure to track location movements within a booking. Placements are defined for only the custodial populations in Electronic Home Detention, Secure Detention and Work Education Release. A placement occurs the first time that a person enters a custodial population, but is only counted once in a booking for each of the three populations. One booking can therefore create no more than three placements. The placement is counted in the month the placement occurred, not necessarily in the month the booking occurred.

- Community Center for Alternative Program (CCAP): A non-custodial community corrections based program that provides structured non-custodial programs that can consist of supervision, treatment services, and sanctions.
- CCAP Basic is for pre-sentenced, pre-trial and requires participants to report by telephone 7 days per week. The Court may order random urinalysis tests.
- Average Daily Enrollment: The number of days a participant has an open case during the month. It is the difference between the closed date and the active date within the month. When a case is closed, then subsequently reactivated, it is the sum of all "active spans" excluding days when the case was closed during the month.
- Admissions: Number of cases initially activated (i.e. using the first active date) in the month. There is one admission per case even when a case is closed and then reactivated.
- Calendar Length of Stay (in days): Average number of days participants were enrolled in CCAP for persons whose cases closed during the month. It is calculated as the total sum of days from the first active date to the final closed date less any time the case was closed.

#### Definitions

- Community Center for Alternative Program (CCAP): A non-custodial community corrections based program that provides structured non-custodial programs that can consist of supervision, treatment services, and sanctions.
- CCAP Enhanced participants typically report for programs and services offered from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM, Monday through Friday. Participants receive an individual needs assessment and are scheduled for a variety of programs and services. CCAP also provides referrals to community-based programs. Court ordered random drug tests monitor illegal drug use and consumption of alcohol.
- Average Daily Enrollment: The number of days a participant has an open case during the month. It is the difference between the closed date and the active date within the month. When a case is closed, then subsequently reactivated, it is the sum of all "active spans" excluding days when the case was closed during the month.
- Admissions: Number of cases initially activated (i.e. using the first active date) in the month. There is one admission per case even when a case is closed and then reactivated.
- Average Daily Workload: Average number of CCAP participants attending a program during the month. It is calculated as the sum of all CCAP attendance contacts in the month for enhanced cases divided by the number of program days in the month.
- Average Sentence Length (in days): Average imposed sentence length for persons admitted in the month. It is calculated using only participants who have a sentence; values of "999" in COMCOR are excluded. If a case has more than one sentence, the longest sentence is used in the calculation.
- Calendar Length of Stay (in days): Average number of days participants were enrolled in CCAP for persons whose cases closed during the month. It is calculated as the total sum of days from the first active date to the final closed date less any time the case was closed.

- Average Daily Enrollment (ADE): Mean number of persons enrolled in a non-custodial program, irrespective of program participation. Total number of enrollee days divided by the number of days in the time-period; calculated as start date to closed date.
- Admission: A single event during a calendar month in which a person is processed into one of the non-custodial programs operated by the Division of Community Corrections and the Juvenile Alternatives to Secure Detention programs including Day Reporting, Evening Reporting, Group Care and Work Crew. For DRC, it is a count of new referrals in the month.
- Average Daily Workload (ADW): Mean number of persons in non-custodial populations based on program participation days within a time-period. Total number of active participation days divided by program participation days in the time-period.

**Definitions**

- Pre-Sentence: The portion of the criminal justice process from time of arrest to time of sentencing. The pre-sentence time is often significantly longer than the pre-adjudication time, due to the length of time between judgment and sentence.
- Misdemeanor: Misdemeanors and Gross Misdemeanors. A misdemeanor is any crime punishable by a fine of not more than one thousand dollars, or by imprisonment in a county jail for not more than ninety days or by both such fine and imprisonment. A gross misdemeanor is any crime punishable by imprisonment in the county jail for a maximum term of not more than one year or by a fine in an amount fixed by the court of not more than five thousand dollars, or by both such imprisonment and fine.
