

Marking of Deposition Designations for Judge Parisien's Court

Please follow the guidelines below when marking depositions to be presented to Judge Parisien in consideration for use during a trial in her courtroom.

USE ONE SET OF DEPOSITIONS TO MARK FOR THE JUDGE'S CONSIDERATION, as follows:

- Moving Party marks with brackets or highlights their designations in a particular color (i.e. yellow highlighter)
- Opposing Party marks their objections in ink-pen (blue or black), on the page, next to the highlighted portion to which they are objecting and tabs the page with a post-it note. (Do not write objections on the tabs.)
- Opposing Party marks with brackets or highlights counter-designations in a different color from that used by the moving party (i.e. green highlighter)
- Moving Party marks their objections in a different color of ink-pen (black or blue), on the page, next to the highlighted portion of the counter-designation to which they are objecting and tabs the page with a post-it note. (Do not write objections on the tabs.)
- Provide the marked depositions to the bailiff as close to the beginning of the trial as possible, and well in advance of intended use.
