#### 1. Introduction

The King County Consortium Annual Action Plan (Action Plan) guides the investment of federal housing and community development funds for the program year beginning January 1 and ending December 31. This substantial amendment of the 2019 Action Plan is a requirement of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), in order for the King County Consortium (Consortium) to receive the allocation related to the first funding round of Community Development Block Grant Coronavirus (CDBG-CV) and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG-CV) from the CARES Act. The amount of funding King County will receive is:

CDBG-CV \$3,343,731 ESG-CV \$964,066

These funds are used to prevent, prepare for and respond to the COVID 19 pandemic throughout King County in 2020. The Consortium includes nearly all of the suburban cities in the county, as well as the unincorporated areas of the county. The Consortium is an interjurisdictional partnership of King County and the cities and towns of Algona, Black Diamond, Beaux Arts, Bothell, Burien, Carnation, Clyde Hill, Covington, Des Moines, Duvall, Enumclaw, Hunts Point, Issaquah, Kenmore, Kirkland, Lake Forest Park, Maple Valley, Medina, Mercer Island, Newcastle, Normandy Park, North Bend, Pacific, Redmond, Renton, Sammamish, SeaTac, Shoreline, Skykomish, Snoqualmie, Tukwila, Woodinville, and Yarrow Point. The Consortium does not include the City of Seattle. The cities of Auburn, Bellevue, Kent, and Federal Way participate in the Consortium for the use of HOME funds for affordable housing. These four cities receive their own CDBG entitlement and prepared separate Amendments to their 2019 Action Plans.
