Waste Reduction and Recycling (Level One)

- · Benson Hill Elementary School achieved a recycling rate of 43 percent.
- The school established a student Green Team made up of 50 fifth-grade students.
 The team was trained by a King County Green School's Program representative and they helped monitor lunch time waste during the school year.
- Teachers were given talking points to teach students prior to the recycling kick-off.
 Waste reduction and recycling (WRR) practices and why they are important were shared via all-school announcements, as were WRR school successes.
- Green Team members created and displayed 3-dimensionial posters using actual recyclable materials.
- To reduce food waste, Benson Hill set up a share table where students were able to place or take unopened, packaged cafeteria foods.
- · Reusable trays and bulk dispensers were used in the cafeteria.
