Waste Reduction and Recycling (Level One)

- Mark Twain Elementary increased its recycling rate from 45 percent in January 2019 to 50 percent in April 2019.
- The school started a student Green Team which met monthly and made regular announcements about its activities.
- The school reduced paper use by posting student assignments on the school
 website, making double-sided copies, and placing paper trays in classrooms for
 paper used only on one side so students could use the blank sides.
- "Take or bring only what you will eat" messages were shared to reduce food waste. The school also encouraged students and families to pack lunches from home in reusable containers.
- The school used durable, reusable trays and utensils in its cafeteria.
- A recycling bin with a recycling sign was placed next to each garbage bin in classrooms, offices, cafeteria, and other areas of the school.
- The school collected food scraps and other compostable materials to be transported to Cedar Grove Composting.
