



Project Update: April 2010

Sewer Work along 102nd Avenue Southeast, April 5-16

Beginning the week of April 5, weather permitting, King County's contractor for the Bellevue Pump Station Upgrade Project will begin the process of connecting the temporary pump station to the existing force main that conveys wastewater flows from Bellevue to the Swaylocken Pump Station, located on Bellevue Way near the I-90 interchange.

This work will require closure of the west lane of 102nd Avenue Southeast near the intersection with SE 6th street. Traffic control personnel will be on site maintain traffic flow. Community members can expect increased activity and noise beginning the week of April 5 through the week of April 16. The work is weather dependent and schedule may vary.

King County's project team urges the community to drive slowly and be alert when passing near the work site.

What to Expect

- Increased construction activity and noise starting the week of April 5- April 16. Work is weather dependent so schedule may vary.
- Traffic reduced to one lane at the intersection of 102nd Avenue Southeast and SE 6th Street. East lane of 102nd Avenue Southeast will remain open.
- Traffic control personnel on site to ease traffic congestion around work site.
- Work will occur weekdays between 7 a.m. - 4 p.m.

King County is upgrading the Bellevue Pump Station to protect public health and the environment. The existing pump station is more than 40 years old and must be expanded to accommodate Bellevue's growing wastewater treatment needs. King County is committed to being a good neighbor.
