Project Update: October 2, 2009

Demolition of existing pump station and generator buildings to begin October 5

King County's contractor for the Bellevue Pump Station Upgrade project recently completed installation and operational testing of the temporary pump station system. The temporary pump station will provide continued wastewater service while the existing pump station and generator buildings are taken out of service and demolished. Decommissioning of the existing pump station and generator began on September 28.

Demolition of the existing pump station and generator buildings will begin the week of October 5 and expected to be completed by October 16.

What to expect

- Increased noise, dust and activity coming from the site starting Monday, October 5 through October 16 as crews demolish existing pump station and generator buildings.
- Construction activities will occur weekdays between 7 a.m. – 5 p.m. Neighbors will be given advance notice of any construction activities that may require extended work hours.

King County is upgrading the Bellevue Pump Station to protect public health and the environment. The existing pump station is more than 40 years old and must be expanded to accommodate Bellevue's growing wastewater treatment needs.
