BELLEVUE PUMP STATION UPGRADE FALL 2009

Project Update: November 6, 2009

Demolition of existing pump station complete, foundation work begins.

King County's contractor for the Bellevue Pump Station Upgrade project recently completed demolition of the existing pump station and will begin drilling structural support piles for the foundation of the upgraded pump station building.

Starting Monday, November 9 crews will begin drilling the structural support piles using auger cast piles. Auger cast piles are a drilled and cement pumped pile, not a driven pile. This eliminates the excessive noise and vibration created by hammer driven piles.

The temporary pump station system will continue to provide wastewater service to the community while construction progresses on the upgraded pump station.

What to expect

- Large crane arrives on site week of November 9.
- Increased activity and noise coming from the site starting the week of **Monday, November 9 through November 13** as crews begin drilling auger cast piles.
- Construction activities will occur weekdays between 7 a.m. – 5 p.m. Neighbors will be given advance notice of any construction activities that may require extended work hours.

King County is upgrading the Bellevue Pump Station to protect public health and the environment. The existing pump station is more than 40 years old and must be expanded to accommodate Bellevue's growing wastewater treatment needs.
