

# Art for the Fremont Siphon

At the Fremont Siphon, and at other wastewater treatment facilities, art can tell the story of the utility's mission to protect public health and the environment by treating wastewater and recycling its byproducts. Art offers a visually interesting and interactive way to engage visitors and neighborhood residents in a greater understanding of how the process works. Art reinforces the County's environmental messages and services and promotes positive "at home" behaviors that help to reduce pollution and protect our environment.

A 5-person selection panel that is comprised of a neighborhood resident, artist, design professional and business owner, representative from the Fremont Arts Council or Fremont Abbey Arts Center will choose three finalists to interview and one artist for the commission.
