## Burke-Gilman Trail detour shifts south

King County's contractor for the Fremont Siphon Replacement Project continues work to relocate the City of Seattle Combined Sewer Overflow (CSO) drain pipe. The contractor's work area will shift north away from the Ship Canal this week.

To maintain safety on the Burke-Gilman Trail, the trail detour will move south of the work area closer to the Ship Canal (see map). The southern detour will be in effect through November.

Brief delays may occur. Part of Fremont Canal Park between the trail and the project site will be fenced and closed to the public during this phase of the project.

Thank you for your patience and cooperation during trail detours. Trail safety is a top priority for King County and its contractor.

### What to expect:

- Work from 7 a.m. – 6 p.m. on weekdays
- Burke-Gilman Trail detour at project site in effect at all times
- Crews and equipment on and around the Fremont project site
- Fencing and no public access to Fremont Canal Park between trail and project site

Please avoid the project area and sidewalks on N.W. 36th St. next to the project area. Please do not engage individuals working at the site. Community members can ask questions or share concerns about the project 24 hours a day by calling the project
